- 2.6 Innovative processes adopted by the institution in Teaching and Learning
 - 1. **Entry level assessment test**(MCQ type) are conducted each year to assess the knowledge level of the newly admitted first year Honours students,.
 - 2. Interdisciplinary lectures have been conducted in several departments to enhance the knowledge of the students.
 - 3. To bridge the knowledge gap of the slow learners, they are provided with the facilities like remedial classes, tutorial classes, readymade notes, instruction in vernacular etc.
 - 4. For the advanced learners, facilities like good stock of reference books, sophisticated instruments and equipment, easy access to e-learning resources, ICT infrastructure etc. are provisioned.
 - 5. A certificate course on Communicative English has been introduced for utilizing the language laboratory.
 - 6. Feedbacks on curriculum are obtained formally by means of filled in forms from the students and informally through verbal discussion from other stake holders.
 - 7. Corrective measures are adopted on the basis of the analyses of such feedback reports.

- IQAC has regularly monitored the attendance status of the students in the class room; it has supervised the preparation of academic calendar& time-table and publication of the result of internal examinations.
- ❖ IQAC has taken initiative to set up departmental libraries in all the departments for making the teaching learning process more convenient.
- ❖ IQAC organizes "Orientation Programmes" for the first year students of Arts, Science and Commerce departments separately to make them aware of the rules and regulations of the college related to academic matters, usage of library resources and functioning of different cells and committees.
- ❖ IQAC has introduced "Entry level assessment test" for the newly admitted students of 1st year Honours at the beginning of the session, to assess their knowledge.
- ❖ IQAC encourages the departments to introduce some innovative measures in the teaching process like students' seminar, subject quiz, interdisciplinary lectures, book review etc.
- * IQAC organizes regularly seminars on contemporary issues to enrich the teachers and the students.
- ❖ In addition to these activities, this year the IQAC has taken initiative to install an **Integrated Library Management Software** used for systematic operation of the library related activities like acquisition, cataloguing, circulation, serial control, report generation etc.
- ❖ IQAC has taken initiative towards the establishment of a laboratory under **BOOST programme**. Room no. 201 was renovated and converted to BOOST Laboratory. IQAC has also supervised the installation of the instruments purchased with the BOOST fund.

3.26 Major Activities during the year in the sphere of extension activities and Institutional Social Responsibility

> Energy Reduction Initiative:

The institution is always in favour of 'Go Green' initiatives and has installed a solar power generating unit at the roof top of the college building on 3rd March, 2016 which was sponsored by the Ministry of Power, Government of West Bengal. Installation of this solar panel has reduced the consumption of electricity to a considerable extent as revealed by the analysis of last twelve months electric bills. A report has also been prepared by the institution on this, where the energy reduction issue is presented in detail with supporting data.

> College Projects:

Several college projects have been initiated such as:

- i) Nature Trail, in collaboration with Nature Club of the college
- ii) *Benefit of installation of Solar Panel*, in collaboration with Department of Physics
- iii) Well-being of Senior Citizens, in collaboration with Arts Department.
- **iv)** A Survey of Arsenic & Microbial contamination in House-hold drinking Water, in collaboration with Department of Chemistry, Sammilani Mahavidyalaya and Department of Microbiology, Dinabandhu Andrews College.

➤ Generation of Bio-fertilizer within the college campus for in-house consumption:

This is another eco-friendly initiative. The organic wastes generated within the premises of the college including the leaf litter, twigs etc. are collected in a pit, constructed at one end of the campus, which after decomposition is converted into bio fertilizer. This bio fertilizer is applied to the plants grown in the front garden of the college. Thus the process serves in two ways: it solves the problem of disposal of organic wastes and at the same time reducing the use of chemical fertilizer makes the environment pollution free.

Beginning of yoga sessions for the students:

To ensure healthy mind and body, weekly Yoga classes for the students are going on since September, 2016. A considerable number of students have joined the course and are attending the classes with great enthusiasm.

> Social Outreach Programmes conducted by the NSS unit:

The NSS unit organized a number of activities in the session 2016-17 to establish a linkage between the campus and the community in true sense. A grant of Rs. 37,125 was sanctioned by the University of Calcutta for the said purpose. Some of the activities organized by the NSS unit during the session 2016-17 are listed below:

- Under the initiative of the NSS unit and Humming Bird Nature club, 'Vanomahotsav' (tree plantation festival) was celebrated on 13th July, 2016. A rally, 'Walk for Tree' was also organized on the same day from the college campus to the Shahid Smriti Yuva Shakti Sangha Club. The teachers, students, non-teaching staff and the alumni members of the college joined the rally with colourful posters bearing relevant slogans. Tree saplings were planted within the college campus as well as in Shahid Smriti Colony to generate awareness on clean environment among the residents.
- On 14th September, 2016, a seminar was organized on Health and Cleanliness and a lecture was delivered by Dr. Tapas Jana on 'Cleanliness and Healthy Habits' along with a slide show.
- On 15th September, 2016, the NSS unit organized a poster competition on cleanliness.

- A cleaning programme was also organized on the same day with active participation of the students, teachers, non-teaching staff, alumni members and other stake holders.
- On 24th September, 2016, whatsapp group, 'NSS Yuva Bahini' has been formed under the initiative of the Programme Officer, Smt. Lupsy Mohanty Roy to maintain regular communication.
- On 4th October, 2016 the teachers and members of NSS unit visited a local old age home, 'Seva', and spent some time with the elderly people there to boost them up mentally.
- On the 3rd of November, 2016, a field visit to *Santragachhi Bil* (wetland) was arranged for bird watching under the joint initiative of the NSS unit and the Department of Zoology. A report has also been prepared subsequently by the students under the supervision of the concerned teachers where the basic observations on the avi fauna of the Santragachhi wetland, the threats and hazards they are facing and some possible solutions are summarized.
- In connection with the celebration of National Youth Day on 13th January, 2017, a thalassemia screening camp was organized within the college premises.

5. Student Support and Progression

5.1 Contribution of IQAC in enhancing awareness about Student Support Services

- Disseminating value-based and holistic education to create architects of a humane, rational and just society,

6.2. Does the Institution has a management Information System?

The college has a software to cater to the annual online admission process; the college office has Tally ERP 9.0 Gold to take care of the financial and accounting aspects and student database as well; the library has WEB-OPAC and KOHA softwares (with cloud computing) and N-LIST membership; the salary of the teaching and non-teaching staff is computed by MS-Excel software though disbursement is through HRMS of WBIFMS of the Govt. of West Bengal. All the office computers are on LAN. The college, however, has a plan to logically integrate the data management systems towards setting up a sophisticated management information system.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

Revise

Though the college enjoys no power to directly modify the curriculum, however, it encourages all those activities which are related to curriculum development in one way or the other, like writing text books, attending syllabus related workshops of the University, preparing question bank, etc.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Blended learning is encouraged where traditional time tested chalk and board teaching methods are supplemented by interactive and effective teaching and learning techniques like:

- organizing seminars and industrial visits for students
- encouraging students to avail themselves of the department library facilities
- screening movies related to subjects
- organizing faculty exchange programmes
- use of virtual classrooms and smart classrooms
- Conducting project work, field trips, etc.
- maintaining work plans and work diary by the teachers to help make the teaching process systematic
- Reviewing academic results and taking feedback from students to enable teachers to improve their teaching methods.
- Maintaining well-equipped laboratories and upgrading them periodically to meet the requirements in specific subjects.
- maintaining a 'Language Lab' for those students who need to improve their communication skill
- Using the wifi connection for students and teachers to strengthen the teaching and learning process.

Besides, the college has also taken up a strategy to categorize the students of respective honours departments on the basis of their knowledge level by means of 'entry level assessment tests' and to adopt teaching methods accordingly, like remedial coaching for academically backward students, seminar method for advanced group, preparatory language classes for those who are weak in English, etc.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

The college has adopted some new and innovative strategies in the field of examination and evaluation. To assess the standard of knowledge of a student on the subject with which he or she is intending to pursue higher studies, entry level assessment tests are been taken at the beginning of the academic year. Moreover, the college has introduced open book examination system in some selected subjects on experimental basis to enhance the critical thinking power and analytical ability of the students. In the Department of Commerce, internal examinations based on MCQ system to be introduced to keep abreast with the new semester based CBCS system to be introduced by the University in the Commerce stream.

6.3.4 Research and Development

The institution always encourages the faculty members to pursue research work and as an outcome, this year three minor research projects in the disciplines of History, Philosophy and Microbiology have been completed with UGC grants. The college provided the necessary infrastructural support for the said projects. The college not only motivates the faculty members for pursuing research work, but it believes that research oriented outlook should be imbibed among the students also. Keeping this in mind, it has introduced short duration project work on some relevant physical and social issues in some of the departments, in addition to the normal university curriculum. In course of doing such project work, the students get acquainted with the basic approaches necessary to follow while dealing with a research problem.

6.3.5

Library: As suggested by the Library Sub-committee, the college has taken initiative to extend the library spatially in order to provide reading facilities to more students at a time. The extension work is on the verge of completion. KOHA (with cloud computing) software has been installed for automation of certain functions of library operation. Moreover, the college has procured the N-List and Inflibnet facilities so that both the students and teachers can easily access the electronically available vast reading resources.

ICT: A well equipped, multimedia language laboratory has been set up utilizing the UGC grant under 12th plan having a capacity to accommodate 20 users at a time. The existing UGC-sponsored Net Resource Centre has also been expanded making provision for more users. Moreover, the college has created a virtual classroom with adequate audio-visual and internet facilities.

Physical Infrastructure/Instrumentation: The Canteen, Students' union room, NSS room, Gymnasium, etc. have been relocated in the newly constructed annex building and the space occupied by these aforementioned establishments are now utilized as class rooms, laboratories etc. In an undergraduate college like ours, a gap between academic expansion and available infrastructure is a very common phenomenon. To cope with this problem, the institution has adopted a policy of 'optimum utilization' of the available infrastructural facilities. The space and infrastructural facilities of the newly established language laboratory are simultaneously being used by the Department of Commerce as their Project Laboratory on sharing basis during such periods of time when the language laboratory is not in use.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

Revised

Apart from providing privilege to the teaching faculty for career advancement and academic upgrade, the college has also organized a two week training programme for non-teaching members on "Advanced Tally" in collaboration with the experts from George Telegraph. Besides, training for handling the software purchased for the purpose of admission, has also been arranged for the concerned teaching and non-teaching members of the Admission Sub-committee.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

The shortage of full time teaching staff is a major problem of the college and the institution's top priority is to resolve the issue at its earliest. The six substantive teaching posts lying vacant since long had been filled up with the joining of six new teachers recommended by the West Bengal College Service Commission. Moreover, the college has completed the formalities for creation of some new teaching posts and has submitted the proposals to the Higher Education Department of the Govt. of West Bengal for approval.

The college will place requisition to the West Bengal College Service Commission for filling up of two substantive teaching posts which have fallen vacant due to one of the teachers becoming Principal of another college and another joining Jadavpur University as an Associate Professor,

The college has also submitted proposal for creation of new non-teaching posts as well as filling up of three posts that have fallen vacant due to promotion of one incumbent, sudden death of one incumbent, and resignation of the third one for joining Jadavpur University.

The college will place requisition to the West Bengal College Service Commission for the post of Librarian which has fallen vacant due to the erstwhile Librarian joining Gour Banga University as an Assistant Professor.

6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

No industry interaction/collaboration has been arranged/established by the institution this year.

6.3.9 Admission of Students

Instead of appointing an external agency for processing the on-line admission data and preparation of the merit list, this year the college purchased software for the said purpose. Required training has been provided to some of the teaching and non-teaching members and they themselves have done the entire admission work.

On the basis of the report, three areas have been identified where there is scope of doing some work. These are rainwater conservation, energy conservation and waste management. Apart from this "Arannya Saptaha" has also been celebrated like the previous years, and campus cleaning has been organised by the NSS Unit of the college.

7. Innovations and Best Practices

- 7.1 Innovations introduced during this academic year which have created a positive impact on the functioning of the institution. Give details.
 - For maintenance of a green campus trees are planted annually and are nurtured.
 - The existing matured trees have also been numbered and labelled.
 - Three RO filter have been installed in different corners of the college campus to supply pure and safe drinking water.
 - Measures are being adopted for making the college premises a No-smoking and plastic free zone
 - A Bio-fertilizer unit has been generated within the college campus for in-house consumption of the regular bio-waste.
 - A Gallery has been constructed around the playground of the college.
 - ➤ The Department of Botany has been opened for redressing the growing demand of Zoology Honours students.
 - > Replacement of the normal bulbs by LED bulbs and installation of a smart meter are the other initiatives taken in this direction.
 - For awareness and sensitization of students, programmes related to environmental consciousness are being organized and students are encouraged to participate.
 - ➤ The institution has undertaken a number of innovative endeavours during the last four years, for upgradation of its academic standard and enhancement of efficiency in administration. These include introduction of Entry level Assessment Test and Orientation Programme for the new comers, installation of KOHA in the library and Tally ERP 9 GOLD in the office, formation of Examination Core committee, organization of value education lectures etc.
 - > One more smart /ICT enabled class room has been constructed in Geography department to cater the need of the students and teachers.
 - Three college projects have been initiated by the college to create research environment within the college.
 - > Each department has established Departmental seminar libraries accessible to the students for consultation.
 - For urgent Library work, five alumni students are recruited on 'per day' basis remuneration, under the UGC scheme 'Earn while you learn', following the guidelines of the parent University.
 - > Several value added seminars/ workshops/educational excursions/ social outreach programmes have been organized to create a positive impact on the functioning of the college.

- 7.2 Provide the Action Taken Report (ATR) based on the plan of action decided upon at the beginning of the year.
 - ♦ IQAC successfully conducted the event of onsite visit of NAAC peer team members from 10th to 12th November, 2016. The institution has got B⁺⁺ grade with CGPA 2.82.
 - The department of Botany has been opened and Botany (General course) has been introduced in this year and the Botany General laboratory has been set up. A contractual teacher for the said purpose has been recruited by the college.
 - Actions have been taken to renovate Principal's chamber, Office rooms and IQAC room and the work has been completed.
 - ♦ A three month certificate course on Communicative English has been introduced.
 - Renovation and up gradation of the facilities of boys' and girls' Common room have been done.
 - Smart class facilities have been installed in the rooms already specified for the said purpose.
 - The laboratory sponsored by BOOST has been set up.
 - Two computer work stations have been set in the Humanities faculty common room. In the session 2016-17 the process of digital accession of the books of library using KOHA has been started.
 - An interdisciplinary peer reviewed college journal '*Introspect*' was published in October, 2016.
 - ♦ ICT facility of the UGC sponsored Net Resource Centre has been enhanced.
 - A spectators' gallery has been constructed at the college ground.
 - Annual sports, intra-college football and cricket tournaments have been organized.
 - The medicinal herb garden has been established.

Title: Establishment of departmental libraries

Objective: To facilitate the availability of books to the students throughout the calendar year.

Context: The students of our institution do not have access to the centralized college library after they are sent up to the university examination after they clear the college test examination. This is particularly disadvantageous for the students as they usually undertake intense studying during this period. Also the Guest Teachers are not entitled to borrow books from the centralized college library. To address these problems individual departmental libraries have been established.

Practice and its Implementation: The individual departmental libraries have been stocked with the books that are gifted by the book shops and publishing houses to the teachers as evaluation copies. The teachers, in their turn, have donated these text and reference books to their departmental libraries. Thus, the departmental libraries incur no cost to the college. Of course, the college has provided the book racks and/or almirahs to house the books. The books have been catalogued and accession protocols implemented by the individual departments, thus placing no additional demands on the central library manpower.

Evidence of success: The students were able to borrow the books required at a very crucial period of their study. Also, the guest teachers were able to enhance the knowledge and hence make their teaching more effective by borrowing the relevant books.

Problems encountered: Rare and expensive books cannot, usually, be obtained in this way. Also, the number of books, at this stage, is somewhat low to meet the full demand. However, it is hoped that the collections would grow in numbers as the years pass.

Title: Production of Bio fertilizer on College Campus

Objective- To make the environment of the college and its surroundings clean and dispose the garbage generated in an eco-friendly way.

Context: Inside our college there are a number of large trees which shed a lot of leaves. Also the college canteen and some departments generate biodegradable waste regularly. These are to be disposed of in an eco-friendly way and converted to useful bio-fertilizer.

Practice and its Implementation: Two concrete pits have been constructed inside the college premises. The biodegradable waste generated are collected and put in these pits for composting. After composting, the bio-fertilizer generated is utilized in the college garden. The programme has been implemented by the chemistry department under the supervision of IQAC.

Evidence of success: The programme is successful as the college premises remains clean and college getting free bio-fertilizer.

Problems encountered: More manpower is needed for collection of the wastes.

 - i) a Rally on the issue "Save tree and save Life" to celebrate Arannya Saptaha on 2nd August, 2016.
 - ii) Organized a Seminar on **Human –Elephant interaction in Southern West Bengal** on 3rd October, 2016 and a poster competition on Human Elephant conflict.
- ♣ The Psychological Counselling Cell of the college has organized a talk on the topic 'Young-adult problems of present times' by eminent external speaker on 03.11.2016.
