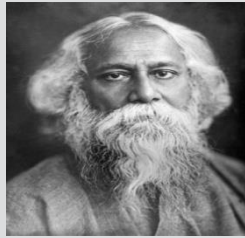

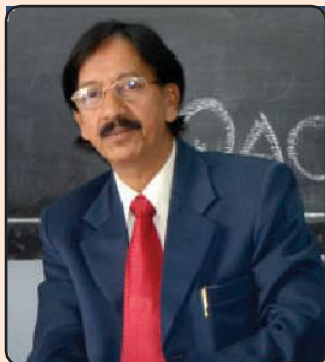

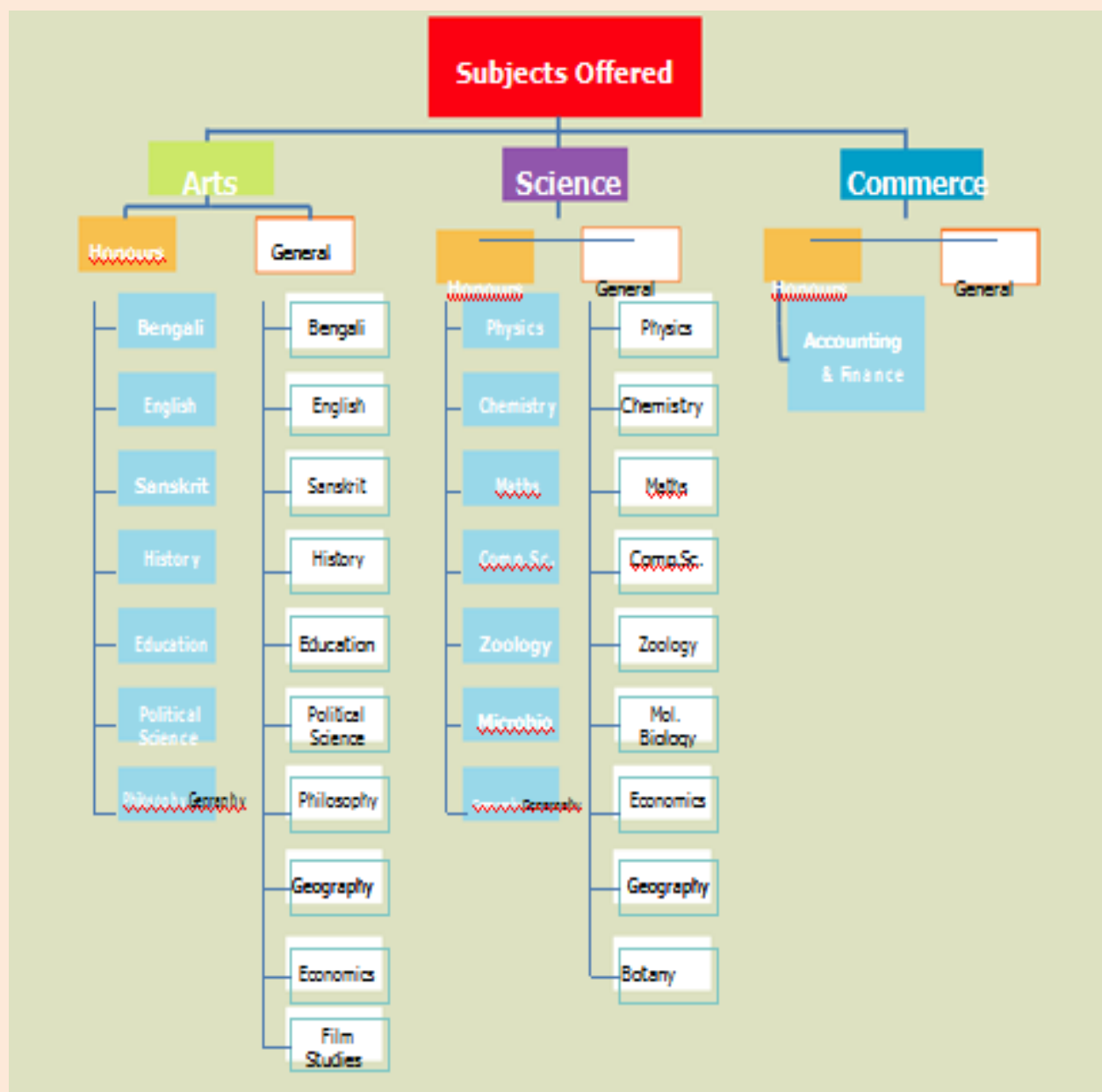

ADMISSION - 2021-22

Usually admission to the undergraduate courses like B.A, B.COM, B.SC takes place during the month of June, immediately after the publication of the results of +2 (H.S/ I.S.C/C.B.S.E) Examination. However, this year is an exceptional one, a Pandemic year. A nation- wide lockdown due to the spread of COVID-19 has delayed the examinations, publication of results, admission everything. It is going to begin from 2nd August,2021 as per the notification of the Department of Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal, No.706 -Edn(CS)/ 10M- 95/14,dated 13. 07.2021.

The Admission procedure is totally online and it follows the rules and regulations laid down by the Council of Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal and the University of Calcutta. Admission is strictly based on the Merit List, published by the college authority.

SPECIAL MEASURES FOR PANDEMIC SITUATION

A candidate, willing to take admission to the under-graduate degree course in 2021-2022 session shall have to pursue semester-wise 3 years course under CBCS as per C.U. regulations vide notification (ref.no:CUS/268(Cir)/18, dated 7th May,2018).

A candidate pursuing a regular course of study for 3 year semester-wise degree course shall have to clear all the semesters in all respects within a span of 5 years from the year of admission to the particular course and combination, failing which enrolment of the candidate shall stand cancelled.

Sub : Online admissions for the Academic Session 2021-22 to all UG & PG Courses

The results of the West Bengal Higher Secondary Examination 2021 and equivalent examinations are expected to be announced shortly. This Department has received queries from different Universities & Colleges regarding the admission modalities to be followed by them for the ensuing academic session 2021-22.

Considering the success achieved in online admission process, and in view of the fact that the requisite infrastructure has already been put in place in the State's higher education institutions, it is hereby informed to all concerned that admissions to all Under Graduate (Honours and General) and Post Graduate courses in the State-funded Higher Education Institutions in West Bengal for the ensuing academic session 2021-2022 will be made online, as per the schedule & modalities detailed below:

Schedule:

For Under Graduate Courses (1st year admission)

a) Date of opening of Online Portal for Application for UG Courses	- 02 nd August 2021
b) Completion of Application in the Online Portal for UG Courses by	- 20 th August 2021
c) Publication of Merit Lists in UG Courses by	- 31 st August 2021
d) Completion of Admission at the UG Courses by	- 30 th September 2021
e) Start of 1 st Semester of UG Courses on	- 1 st October 2021

For Post Graduate Courses (1st year admission)

a) Publication of Results of the Final Semester of UG Courses by	- 31 st August 2021
b) Date of opening of Online Portal for Application for PG Courses	- 1 st September 2021
c) Completion of Application in the Online Portal for PG Courses by	- 15 th September 2021
d) Publication of Merit Lists in PG Courses by	- 20 th September 2021
e) Completion of Admission at the PG Courses by	- 25 th October 2021
f) Start of 1 st Semester of PG Courses by	- Last week of October 2021

Modalities:

- 1) On line admission process should be done based on merit. Prospective students should not be called for counseling or verification of documents during the process of admission. No physical presence will be required at the College / University.

- 2) No Charges shall be taken from the students for (i) scanning/ uploading of documents for admission and (ii) providing/ making available the application form/ prospectus of admission in all UG/ PG level courses like last year.
- 3) Eligible applicants should be informed directly by the College/ University authorities through letter or e-mail or telecommunication.
- 4) Payment of fees should be done only through e-payment or designated banks and not physically at the colleges.
- 5) List of eligible applicants should be handed over to the designated bank branches for verification during payment through banks. Banks will receive admission fees on the basis of merit list.
- 6) All testimonials are required to be uploaded online during application. Verification of documents, if required, should be done only when the students report for the classes in due course. Admission will be cancelled if the documents are found not in conformity with the declaration in the forms submitted on-line.
- 7) The ratio for Home University students and other University students shall be 80:20. However, the unfilled Home University Seats, if any, will be filled up by the outside University students and vice-versa in PG courses.
- 8) All Stakeholders shall adhere to the COVID-19 norms/ protocol, issued by the Government time to time.

Vice-Chancellors of all State-aided Universities are requested to take necessary steps in this regard, including issuing suitable instructions to all the affiliated institutions. However, the Netaji Subhas Open University shall follow the time schedule as per guidelines of Open Distance Learning as done last year.

This advisory does not apply to admission to teacher training courses such as B.Ed., B.P.Ed., M.Ed., or M.P.Ed. etc., for which a separate Notification has been issued.

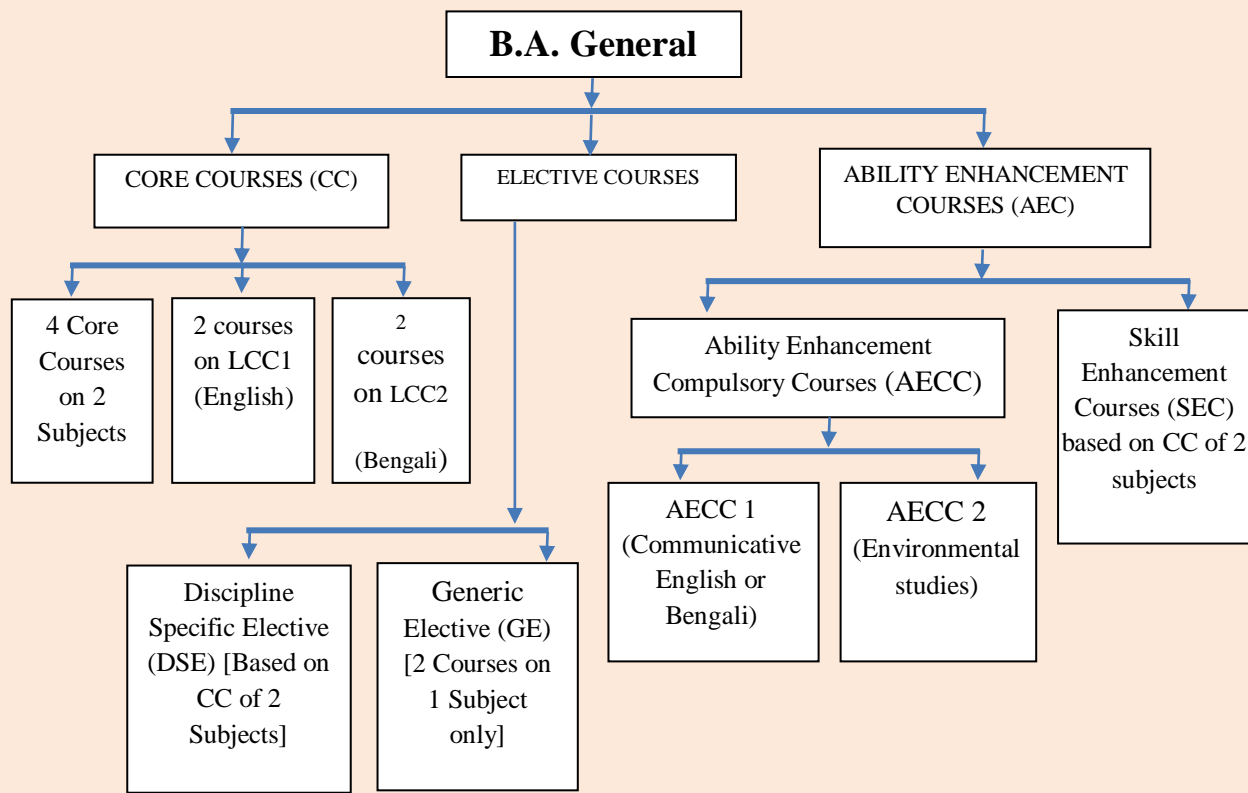

**COURSE STRUCTURE OF B.A. GENERAL UNDER CBCS OF C.U. AS
SPECIFIED IN THE CSR/3/18, DT. 07.05.2018**



Firstly, it must be clear to the understanding of the students that what is CC(Course Course) and what is GE (General Elective):

- Core Courses (CC) is a course, which should compulsory be studied by a student as a core requirement.
- Generic Elective (GE) is an elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline / subject.
- Importance of CC is much more than GE. Number of CC is more than GE as DES and SEC are based on core courses of 2 subjects LCC 1 and LCC 2 are included in the core course also.
- A student must take 2 subjects as CC and 1 subject as GE. So there are 3 elective subjects among which 2 as CC and 1 as GE.

All these courses of CC, GE, LCC, DSE, SEC and AEC are distributed indifferent Semesters in the following manners:

*** Semester mean a half-year term in an Educational institute, i.e. six months. 1 year= 2 Semester, so 3 years = 6 Semester**

A. CC:-

* In SEM I to IV – 2 CC subjects per SEM (100 marks for each course)

*In SEM III, IV, V, VI – SEC on 2 Subjects as CC, 2 courses for each subject

like SEC-A, SEC-B as specified in CSR.

*In SEM V and VI – DSE on those 2 subjects of CC, 2 courses for each subjects as specified in the CSR.

B. GE:-

* In SEM I and II – GE course on 1 subject only

C. AEC (AEC1 and AEC2):

* In SEM I and II – 2 courses on AEC

AECC1 (English/Bengali) in SEM I

AECC2 (Environmental Science) in SEM II

- These courses are based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement.

D. LCC:

* In SEM II, IV, V, VI – LCC1 and LCC2, each of 2 courses.

* LCC is a language Core course on Bengali and English.

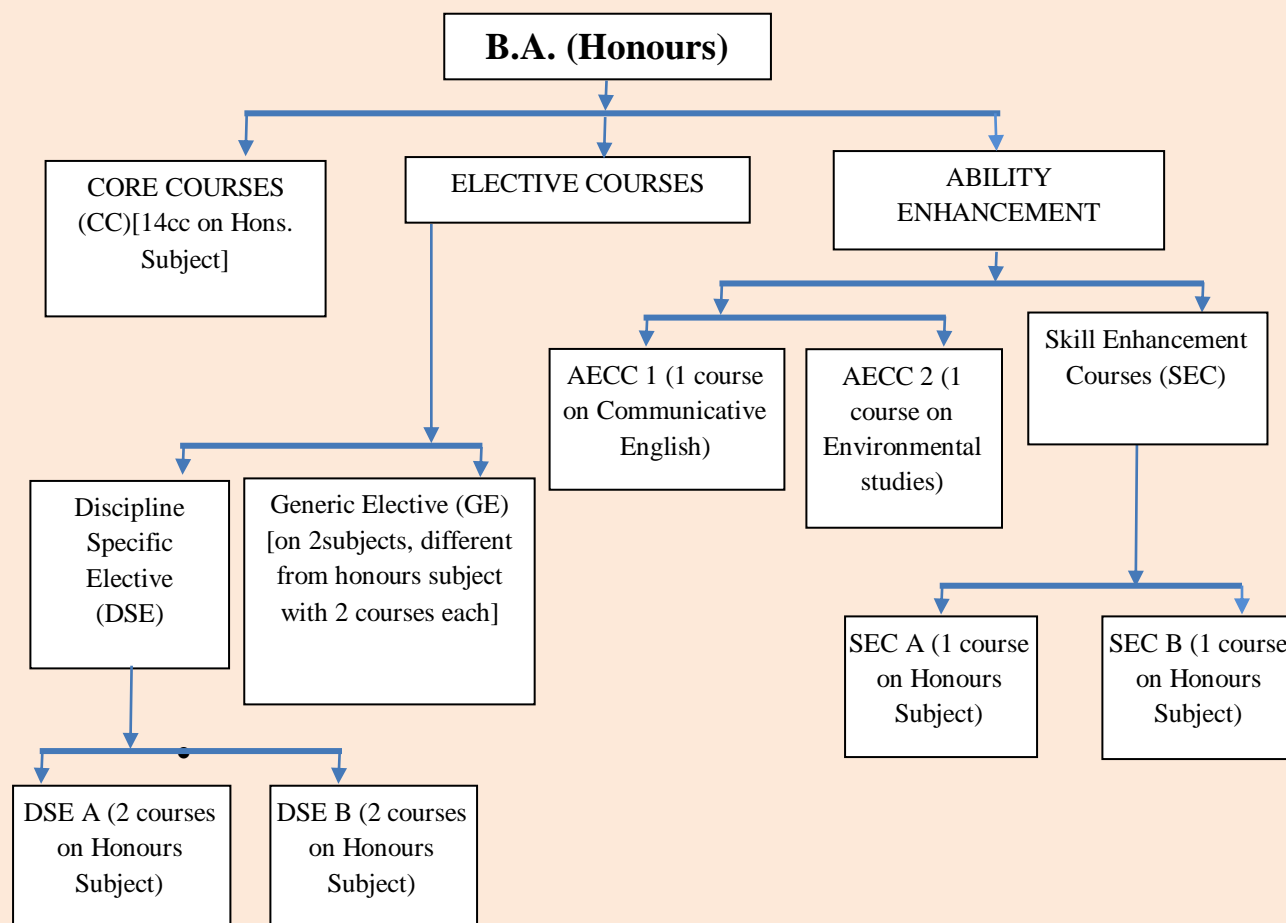

- **CC** is the **Core Course**, which should compulsorily be studied by a student on a core requirement Hons. Student has to study 14 core courses on the honours subject.
- **GE** is **Generic Elective Course**, chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, covers 2 subjects with 2 courses each as specified in the college prospectus.
- **DSE** is **Discipline Specific Elective Course**, to advance knowledge and skill in the core course domain. A student shall have to study 4 DSE courses strictly on honours subject as specified in the CSR.
- **SEC** is **Skill Enhancing Course**, to provide value-based, skill-based knowledge. A student shall have to study 2 SEC on the Honours subjects as specified in the CSR.
- **AECC1** is **Ability Enhancing Compulsory Course**, on communicative English.
- **AECC2** is **Ability Enhancing Compulsory Course**, on Environmental studies.

All these courses of CC, GE, DSE, SEC, AEC are distributed in different Semesters as specified in the CSR:

Semester mean a half-year term in an Educational institute, i.e. six months. 1 year = 2 Semester, so 3 years = 6 Semester.

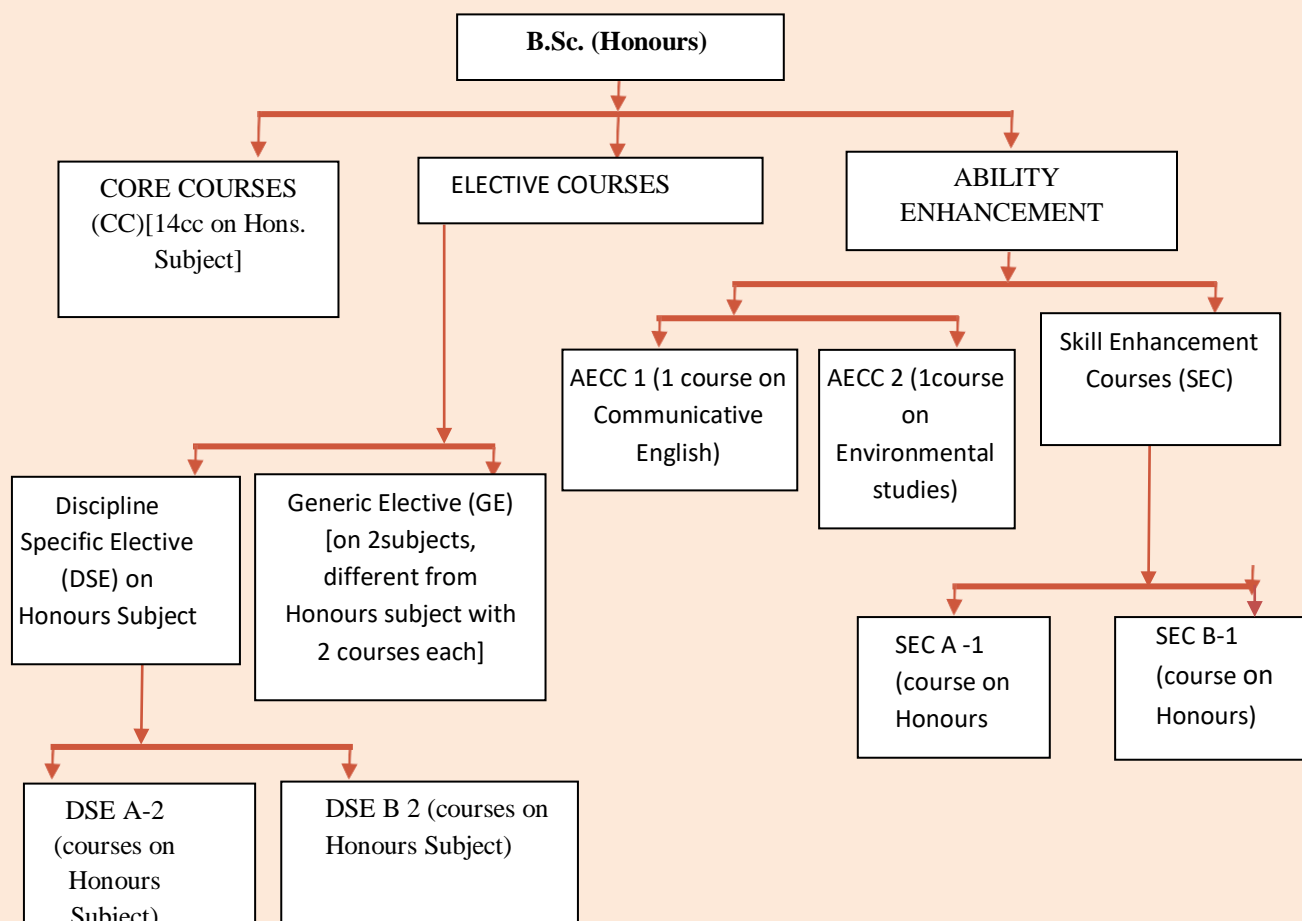
(If group F is selected, it will be considered as B.SC)

- In each group there are three (3) subjects, among which two (2) subjects will be as CC and one (1) subject as GE
- *Bengali & English cannot be taken as GE as per CSR.*
- In addition to this, there is AECC 1 i.e Communicative English / MIL (Bengali) which is different from Bengali / English, mentioned above.

N.B.:-

- Candidates, passed the previous qualifying examination (10+2) in any stream, Arts/ Science/ Commerce with any subjects will be allowed to take admission in B.A. General Course.
- If the candidate has not studied chosen subjects in the previous qualifying examination, he/ she can take it.
- The candidate must have pass marks in the chosen subjects if he/she studied it in 10+2 course.
- If any candidate wants to take up geography or Sanskrit, he/she must have these subjects in 10+2 course.

- **CC** is the **Core Course**, which should compulsorily be studied by a student on a core requirement Honors. Student has to study **14 core courses** on the honours subject.
- **GE** is **Generic Elective Course** chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, covers 2 subjects with **2 courses** each as specified in the college prospectus.
- **DSE** is **Discipline Specific Elective Course**, to advance knowledge and skill in the core course domain. A student shall have to study **4 DSE courses** Strictly on honours subject as specified in the CSR.
- **SEC** is **Skill Enhancing Course**, to provide value-based, skill-based knowledge. A student shall have to study **2 SEC courses** on the Honours subjects as specified in the CSR.
- **AECC1** is Ability Enhancing Compulsory Course on communicative English.
- **AECC2** is Ability Enhancing Compulsory Course on Environmental studies.

All these courses of CC, GE, DSE, SEC, AEC are distributed in different Semesters as specified in the CSR:

COURSE STRUCTURE FOR B.SC GENERAL COURSE

In case of B.Sc. General Programme a student shall have to study

1. CORE COURSE: 4 Core Courses of each of the 3 chosen subjects as specified for each of the first 4 Semesters. In each group there are three (3) subjects, among which two (2) subjects will be as CC and one (1) subject as GE

2. Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course: 6 DSE course strictly on 3 subjects, opted for pursuing core courses, taking exactly two courses from each subject. Such a student shall have to study the curriculum of DSE of the subject concerned as specified for the relevant semester, i.e., DSE-A in the 5th and DSE-B in 6th semester.

Explanation: Each General subject shall have two groups (A & B) of DSE papers. A student shall have to choose one paper from Group A of each of the three subjects in fifth semester and one paper from Group B of each of the three subjects in sixth semester.

3. Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) : AECC courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement. These are mandatory for all disciplines.

i) AECC1 : Communicative English / MIL (Bengali);

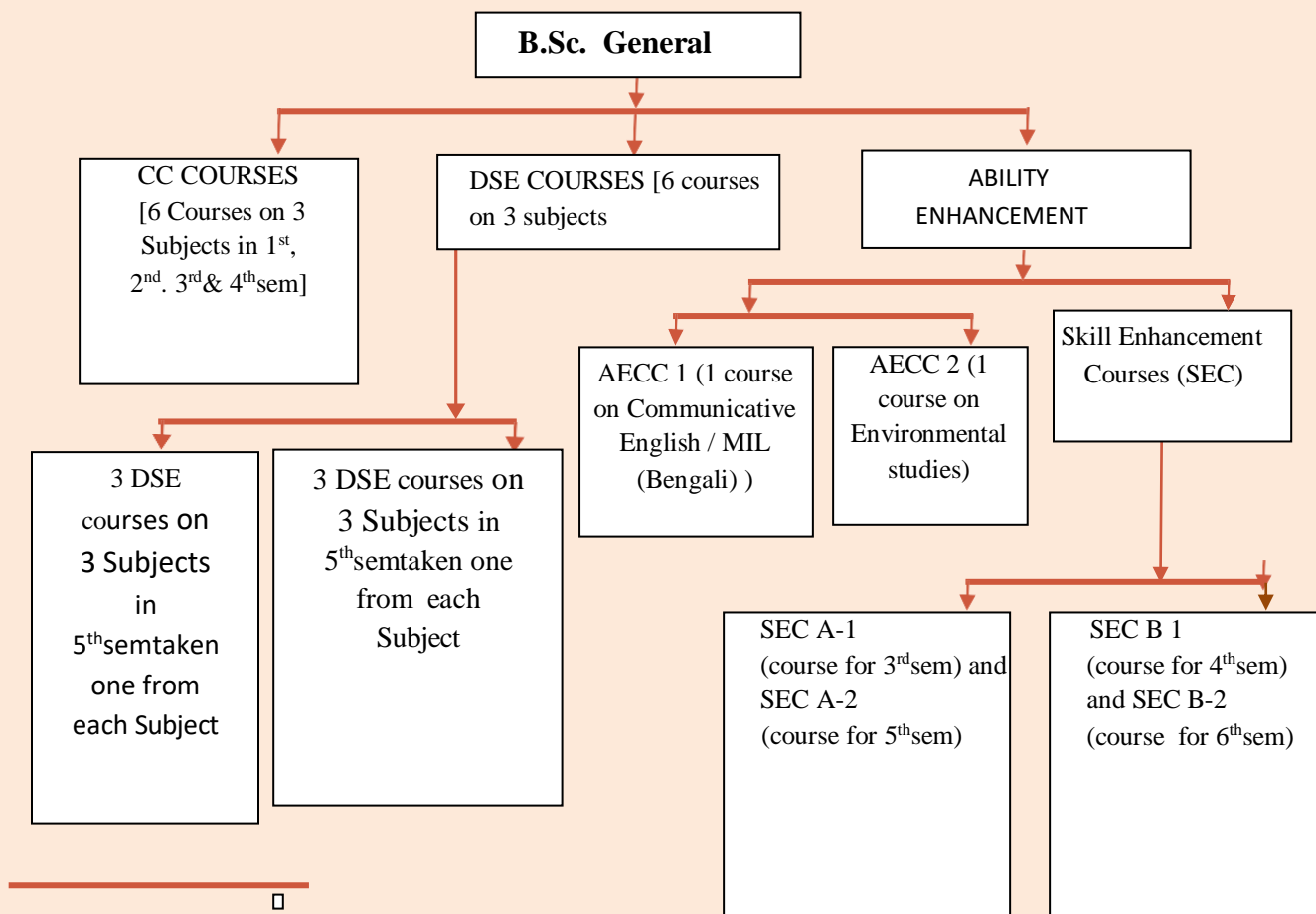
ii) AECC2: Environmental Studies.

4. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): 4 Skill Enhancement Courses strictly on 2 subjects out of the three, opted for pursuing core courses, taking exactly two courses from each subject. Such a student shall have to study the curriculum of SEC of the subject concerned as specified for the relevant semester.

Explanation : Each General subject shall have two groups (A & B) of SEC papers. One paper from Group A of each of the two Core subjects to be chosen in the third and fifth semester, one paper from Group B of each of the two core subjects to be chosen in the fourth and sixth semester.

5. Practical/ Tutorial : Every Core, Discipline Specific and Generic Elective Course shall have a practical or tutorial part.

COLLEGE RULES

➤ **Students are required to maintain regular attendance as stated below:**

- **Under the new CBCS system of B.A., B.Sc. and B.Com. courses, 10 marks in each examination paper have been assigned to attendance of the student.**
- **For attendance between 60-75% 6 marks is to be awarded, 8 marks for attendance between 75-90% and 10 marks for attendance of 90% and above.**

Moreover the following rules are strictly maintained by the various departments of the college:

- Students who are absent for 5 consecutive Honours Periods must take permission from the Principal/H.O.D for attending further classes.
- Laboratory-based students who do not attend Theoretical classes regularly shall not be permitted to attend practical classes.
- Any student absent in any examination on medical grounds must submit before the end of the examination or within three days of its termination Medical Certificate and a letter to the Principal/H.O.D from the guardian stating the ground for his/her absence. Such cases may be considered with sympathy, but it must be understood that illness is not itself a valid excuse.
- **In the present situation a student who is unable to attend adequate online classes due to lack of facilities should immediately inform the concerned teacher/teachers of the department to avoid problems on attendance related issues.**
- Students must carry Identity Cards with them during college hours inside the campus.
- Students are to pay their fees within 20th of every month at the Punjab National Bank, Sammilani Mahavidyalaya Branch after necessary endorsement from the college on week days within the banking hours. Otherwise his / her name will be struck off from the register and re-admission will be permitted only after payment of usual fees. Further a fine @ Rs. 10/- per month will be charged in case of default.
- Students must be in their classes and take their seats at the beginning of each period. They must not enter or leave the class room without permission.
- College property, furniture, library books etc. must be treated with due care.
- Impersonation at roll-call is a punishable offence.
- **Students are required to check the NOTICE BOARD and COLLEGE WEBSITE regularly for important announcements.**
- Students are expected to be formally and decently dressed while in the college **and also when attending online classes.**
- Smoking, chewing tobacco products, spitting and loitering in the college premises are strictly prohibited.
- Students are strictly directed not to pass / make any adverse comments in any SOCIAL MEDIA against the college administration, education policy or against any teaching and

non-teaching staff, **any fellow student or peer** without informing / approaching the Principal with the grievance. This kind of activities which may tarnish the image of the institution shall be treated as unpardonable offence **and strict measures would be taken by the ICC (Internal Complaint Cell) of the college.**

- The usage of any abusive and derogatory language / comments/ gestures on and off the college premises and during the online classes is punishable offences.
- **Any kind of harassment / ragging / malpractice shall be treated as punishable offences and strict measures would be taken by ICC of the college**
- **The students and their parents, at the time of admission are required to fill a copy of the UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational institutions, 2009 for abiding by the rules of anti ragging and anti harassment.**
- **Students must submit filled in feedback forms to the College Authority at the end of each semester.**

REGISTRATION & MIGRATION CERTIFICATE

Regular candidates are required to obtain Registration Certificate from the University. Registration Forms are required to be filled in at the time of admission and the college will not be responsible for registration of those students who take transfer from the College.

Students migrating from other University / Education Board / Councils are admitted to the College provisionally on production of the Migration Certificate from such University/ Education Board / Council.

After such admission they shall apply to the Calcutta University through the Principal of the College, for getting the admission confirmed.

4. Student's Visa in favour of the College (in case of foreign students).The College will not be responsible if the University does not sanction migration of such candidates and in such cases the provisional admission gets cancelled.

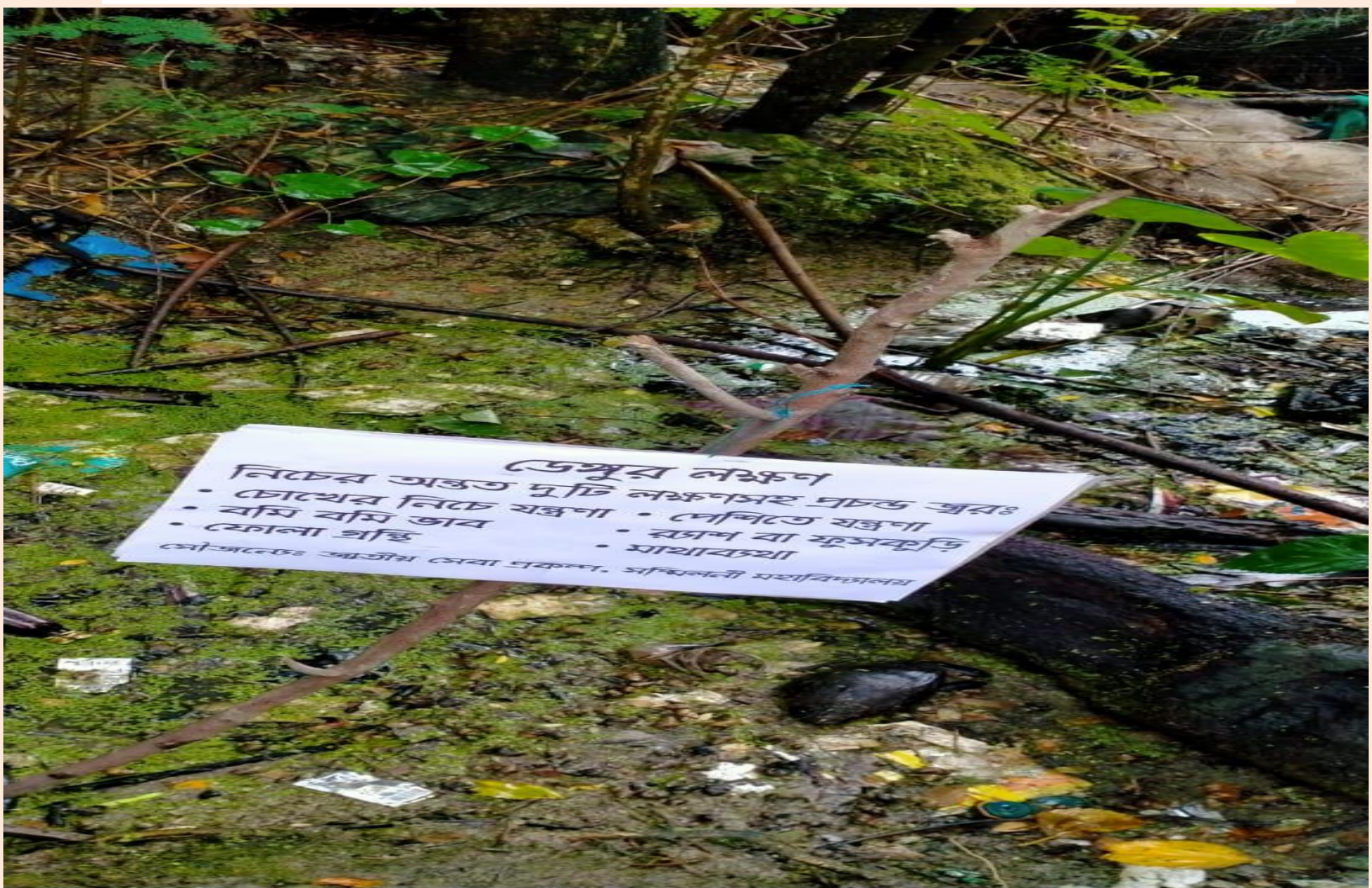


POSTERS CREATED BY VOLUTEERS AT DISPLAY
