



COLLEGE FACILITIES CENTRAL LIBRARY

The central library serves as a hub for advancing knowledge, purposefully crafted to cater to the academic requirements of both students and faculty. Within the Central Library, there exists a wealth of educational materials, including books, magazines, journals, encyclopedias, databases, project reports, audio/video cassettes, and an extensive question bank, all accessible through the Internet. Utilizing a partially automated library management system, users can seamlessly tap into the resources offered by the Central Library. Moreover, the Central Library offers ample seating arrangements and a tranquil environment conducive to learning.

Central Library has handled its day-to-day work through Koha (Integrated Library Management System) with RFID Technology. Presently, it has two different Reading sections for Teachers and Students as well. Currently 22,372 books have been e-catalogued through the Integrated Library Management Software and also have separate Reference section, career guidance section and UGC Net Resource Centre.

The Library provides computer access with high speed internet and Wifi facility to the users. The Library is providing e-journals and e-books to the students and the teachers through NLIST & DELNET consortium. The users can access various open access databases, Open Access Educational Resources etc. through our Digital Library beyond college hours.

Seating Capacity:

The library has two separate reading rooms for students and teachers with a seating capacity of 60.

Monday to Friday 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., Saturday: 10 a.m. to 3.30 p.m. (N.B: Sunday and Holiday: Closed)

Internet connectivity:

High-speed broadband (via fiber optic) connection is available in the library.

Automation:

Automation of the library using KOHA (Integrated Library Management Software) is in full swing, and RFID system has been installed. We also provide WEB-OPAC service to our users. The Central Library is the member of N-LIST (National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly content, Gandhinagar) and DELNET (Developing Library Network, New Delhi) for e-resource access.


P.C. CHANDRA KNOWLEDGE CENTRE:

Sammilani Mahavidyalaya received a grant of Rs. 2 lacs from the P. C. Chandra Group under the scheme of 'Gyandhara Prakalpa' for upgradation of the library of the college. Utilizing the grant, 'P.C. Chandra Knowledge Centre' was established with an objective of helping our students and alumni in pursuing their career. A separate room was renovated for the purpose. Books on career guidance, necessary furniture, two computers, and other accessories were purchased.

Boys' and Girls' Common room	There are separate boys' and girls' common rooms equipped with indoor game facilities.
Playground	There is a playground within the premises of the college where students regularly play cricket, football, and other outdoor games. The annual sports is also organized here.
Canteen	College canteen provides healthy and wholesome food to students and staff members.
Photocopy Centre	The photocopy centre is located in the college premises. Facilities like Internet service, printing, binding, etc. are also available in this centre.
Medical Facility	A medical store runs within the periphery of the institution for the benefit of staff, students, etc. First-aid service is available in the college.
Transport facilities	There is no need to provide transport facilities to the students and the staff because, being located very close to the E.M Bypass and Baghajatin Railway station, the college enjoys very good road and rail connectivity which completely satisfies the requirement of the Students and staff.
Power Facility	The college has two Generators of capacities 34 KVA and 2.4 KVA respectively to supply power at the time of power failure and low voltage. Besides, CESC has installed a Smart-meter on the college premises to ensure uninterrupted supply of electricity. Moreover, a solar power generation unit of 20KW comprising 80 solar panels has been installed to generate 35 to 40 units of electricity per day.
Pure Drinking Water	Six RO water filters have been installed in the college to ensure the supply of pure and safe drinking water.
Post-office	There is a Post-office within the campus of the college to provide services to the students, staff & also local community.
Bank	There is a Punjab National Bank with Branch name Sammilani Mahavidyalaya within the campus of the college to provide banking services to the students, staff & also local community.




